#### Woman's Club Raises \$7,700 for Abused Women

The International Outreach Committee of the Woman's Club of Stuart, together with The Inner Truth Project (ITP), had planned a Casino Night fundraiser last spring. As most are aware, the event was canceled due to the pandemic. However, The Inner Truth Project held its own fundraiser, a virtual showing of films by women called LunaFest, last month.

Many businesses who were sponsors (and donors) of the canceled Casino Night generously agreed to sponsor The Inner Truth Project's LunaFest. Many thanks to the International Outreach team for securing these donations to this very worthy cause. Overall, the committee raised \$7,700 and more than \$2,500 of inkind donations for The Inner Truth Project.

The ITP sold 143 tickets to LunaFest and grossed \$13,000. Many hands were crucial in helping ITP transition from the Casino Night event to the virtual film festival. Thank you! And many thanks for all our members who participated in the LunaFest!

The Inner Truth Project provides services locally for sexually abused women and children. Since last March it has seen an increase of 40% in the demand for services. Thank you again for all of your hard work and dedication on behalf of ITP and the survivors of sexual violence.

#### The Remarkable Grace Linn







Grace Linn, a bright, engaging Past President of the of the Woman's Club, will celebrate her 98<sup>th</sup> birthday on October 18. She's been a member of the General Federation of Women's Clubs for 73 years, including the last 31 years with the Woman's Club of Stuart. During her nearly ten decades, she's always been a woman ahead of her time.

She graduated from high school at the age of 16 in Mingo Junction, Ohio, where her parents, immigrants from southern Italy, settled. Although she was awarded a full college scholarship, she said that young women of her culture didn't leave their parents' homes to go away to college.

But that didn't stop her from learning. In the mid-1960s, she taught herself computer programming using "machine language," a complicated precursor to COBOL computer programming language. "This was before they taught computer courses," she recalled.

Working for a medical center in West Virginia, she started the Computer Department, designing and programming all the financial systems. Sitting on the medical committees, she was able to write several medical programs. The Microbiology Reporting System was shared with medical centers all over the world, and recognized by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) in Atlanta. She also developed the unit dosage pharmacy system that was sold to many hospitals.

After she'd already become a self-taught computer whiz, Grace decided to go to a community college where her daughter was also a student. "We took some classes together," she laughed. "We were on the same side of the debate team arguing the Viet Nam war."

Her career at Weirton Medical Center began as a switchboard operator; she was administrative director of the hospital when she left the job 33 years later. She also chaired the board of directors of West Virginia Community College, and was a board member of a home health agency.

After retiring, Grace taught adult education computer classes and worked as an accountant for a small business. She was the office manager of the Florida Sportsmen Fishing shows for seven years. In addition to her Woman's Club activities, she's been president of the Native Plant Society, active member of the Conservation Alliance, Martin County, and chaired the Martin County Planned Parenthood committee for several years. She was also active in the Tropical Trekkers of the Florida Trail Society.

Today, our members know her as the petite woman who always has a warm smile and an encouraging word. Grace is truly an inspiration. She embodies the spirit of service we should all aspire to --- and she does it gracefully.
